Building Health Care in BonezaKIVU HILLS MEDICAL CENTER

As the year begins, ARM is excited to report the following progress on the construction at Kivu Hills Medical Center.

Electrical and plumbing installations are underway and wall plastering has begun. External and internal windows and doors are being constructed and put in place. Floors and ceilings are next in line for completion. The progress is incredible, and we are thankful for the funding support that has made this project possible. The beautiful picture of the growing structure says it all as each day the community sees the progress and feels the love and care coming to Boneza.

Project Cure from Denver, USA, will soon arrive to complete the "needs assessment" for medical equipment that will then be shipped to Boneza. The local ARM Board is establishing an advisory board for KHMC. This board will include medical professionals who will also help run the medical center. The financial plan for the first year of operations is being established, and the operation is expected to begin as a day clinic later this year. More services will be added as the staff and medical plans expand.

Health Care Just Can't Wait!

Medical Mission Outreach at Kivu Hills Medical Center

Two weeks ago, Tara Sborov and a team of three nurses from Denver, CO, arrived in Boneza to carry out our first Medical Missions Outreach this year. This is Tara's third trip to bring hope to the people of Boneza. This time, the team carried out the Medical Missions Outreach at Kivu Hills Medical Center where they saw 500 people in 2 days! The response of the people was overwhelming! Boneza is so desperate for the



healthcare that they couldn't wait for the medical center to be completed. KHMC is already providing the very much needed medical care to the people of Boneza and the region.

Following her visit, Tara reported the urgent needs and the trends since her last visit. She wrote that while the needs are great and disparate, there are a few common and severe enough to note:

- · Hypertension including high blood pressure that could be easily treated but if left untreated could lead to cardiovascular events like stroke.
- · Sexually Transmitted Diseases Symptoms were treated, but she emphasized that both partners should receive treatment and education in prevention.
- · Dentistry Education for dental care is needed for children and adults to prevent the prevalence of rotten and infected teeth.
- · General Health Education All residents of the community would benefit from general clinical care and health education
- · Other common problems Gastrointestinal issues, GERD, Osteoarthritis, surgical repairs, X-rays, critical care monitoring









Women Entrepreneurs Make a Difference in Boneza

Gertrude Nyiraneza, a 58-year-old mother of nine, has faced her share of hardships in life. Born in Rwanda, she lived through the horrific events of the 1994 genocide, which claimed the lives of her parents, siblings, and husband. Despite these devastating losses, Gertrude has persevered and become a force for good in her community.

In 2020, Gertrude became the president of Ubuntu Trust Group, a women's cooperative that produces handmade fabric bags. The cooperative provides employment and a source of income for its members, many of whom are widows and survivors of the genocide. Under Gertrude's leadership, the group has thrived and become a model for other women's cooperatives in the region.

Through her leadership and hard work with the Ubuntu Trust Group, Gertrude has been able to provide for her family in ways that once seemed impossible. Thanks to the income generated by the cooperative, she has been able to afford health insurance for her family and pay her children's school fees. This has helped to ensure that her children have access to the education they need to build a better future for themselves.

But the Ubuntu Trust Group has given Gertrude more than just a source of income. It has given her a family. The women in the cooperative support each other through difficult times and celebrate each other's successes. Gertrude has found a sense of belonging and purpose in the group, which has helped her to heal from the trauma of the past and move forward with hope for the future.

Each day, 253 eager little girls and boys bounce into our preschools, ready to have fun and learn new things. Their day resembles a typical preschool routine highlighted by the daily bowl of porridge, the nutritional boost that for eleven years now has been a blessing for these children.

Each of the six locations has a teacher and assistant and a support

team that prepares the porridge. The sorghum, wheat, millet, soybeans, and maize are mixed with the cow's milk and cooked to form the nutritious porridge. It is indeed the treat of the day for the children.
